I was appointed a Joint appointment between Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Hospital, Oswestry and Wrexham Maelor Hospital, Wrexham with a contract based at Oswestry with a 60:40 split respectively in Jauary 2003. I undertook elective Hip and Knee service at RJAH and Elective/Trauma service at Wrexham Maelor Hospital, Wrexham between 2003 -2009. I moved over to a full-time position at RJAH due to increasing work load and elective commitments at RJAH.

Sep 2012 – Sep 2016 Clinical Director for Surgery, RJAH Oswestry Based at RJAH, Oswestry full time since 1 September 2009, I perform elective hip and knee and complex revision. I currently perform over 300 Hip and Knee replacements, roughly 50-60 Revision Hip and knee surgeries and until recently hip arthroscopies for femoro-acetabular impingement. I continue provide a complex young hip service along with my colleague since 2009.

In the recent ten years, I have been actively involved in research. I have been a Chief investigator for 2 completed RCTs and one multicentre trial just started. One of which is published with 2 publications, 1 pending publication. I have been actively involved in innovative wound care solutions for predictable wound healing, thus influencing enhanced recovery and safer earlier discharge. I sit on an international panel for incisional wound care utilising negative pressure wound therapy. Our work in NPWT in incisional wound won Best Clinical Research Award by Journal of Wound Care in 2014. More recently I served as an advisor to NICE in their guidance on meditech innovation briefing on PICO negative pressure wound dressings for closed surgical wounds. I have recently been appointed as a Honorory Senior Lecturer from Keele University.

I am involved in developing instrumentations, a design surgeon in a team of 4 international surgeons (Exactech Inc, USA), for a knee implant to enhance safer implantation and improve outcomes. Our work won a Bronze award at an International Design Excellence Awards (IDEA® in USA) and more recently a silver award Annual Medical Design Excellence Awards (MDEA) 2018, USA.

I am an invited speaker at international knee meetings, enhanced recovery and incisional wound care management.

I am actively involved in medical management throughout my career. I have been part of various committee, I was the Chair of Medical Advisory Committee and Vice Chair of Local Negotiating Committee at RJAH from 2008 until 2012 when took over the role of Clinical director for surgery looking after over 40 surgeons and over 20 anaesthetists between September 2012 to September 2016. I now wish to concentrate on teaching, training, clinical research and academics. Together with my colleague we have started an Arthroplsty Fellowship programme this year.

## TEACHING MANAGEMENT AND LEADERSHIP SKILLS:

## Teaching

I make a conscious effort to teach and train junior medical staff, allied medical staff and medical students and have organised teaching programmes, journal clubs and workshops on trauma management.

During my stay at the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Hospital as a registrar I have organised courses for the FRCS (Orth) exam and later been involved in teaching and training at the subsequent courses held at Oswestry.

As consultant I continue to teach and train and examine junior doctors, nurses and physiotherapists. I regularly have visiting surgeons as we are a reference centre for Exactech UK and Smith & Nephew UK.

## Management and Leadership Skills

I have been exposed to taking on responsibilities at an early age. I have been a class head boy on several occasions during my school days. I have regularly been the team leader for sporting events such as cricket during my school days and captained the college table tennis team in medical school.

I was the member of the organising committee (medical school), which managed to host the very first All India level inter-medical collegiate cultural festival in Bangalore, which has since been a yearly event. I was briefly involved in politics and was the Youth Congress vice-president for a year in 1989.

As a consultant I have learnt that it is the organisational skills that keep your practice smooth and trouble free. I take an active role in managing my outpatient and inpatient service.

Despite my busy schedule I take an active role in hospital management. Over the years, I have been part of various committees, I was the Chair of Medical Advisory Committee and Vice Chair of Local Negotiating Committee at RJAH, Oswestry until 2012, subsequently took on the role of Clinical Director for Surgery since September 2012 which I recently relinquished to concentrate on clinical research.

### FELLOWSHIPS:

I completed a year's fellowship in Wrightington Hospital under the supervision of Mr Chris Faux and Mr Tony Browne. I was exposed to vast number of hip and knee reconstructions during this time.

The fellowship was mainly clinical with major hands on training. During this time, I also had ample opportunity to assist other experienced surgeons at this unit.

I came away from this fellowship having reiterated my basic principles of management of arthritic hip and knee, consolidated my surgical skills and learnt the process of decision making in difficult scenarios and vast amount of hands on experience.

I have also completed an AO Trauma Fellowship in 2002 at the Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, Toronto. I spent a very useful 6 weeks at this leading trauma unit learning some of the newer techniques and fixation methods.

## Visits to Overseas and other surgeons

I have visited several overseas orthopaedic units as a trainee. I spent two weeks with the arthroplasty team at the Vancouver General Hospital in April 2001. During my visit to Canada for the AO fellowship, I spent further few weeks with some of the world leaders in hip and knee arthroplasty surgery. I spent a week with Dr Alan Gross watching complex hip revision surgery including massive allograft surgery. I also spent 2 weeks with Dr Cecil Rorabeck learning some complex revision knee surgery. Following this I also had a chance to visit and watch Dr Schatzker and Dr Cameron at work.

I continue to visit colleague surgeons, some of my memorable visits were to Prof Schielders to see hip arthroscopy, FAI surgery and labral repair; and Dr De Witte to learn anterior approach to hip surgery. I have visited several surgeons over UK and in Europe over the last two years.

#### **CAREER FOCUS:**

My career aim is to work on the principles of 'making surgery predictable'. In this pursuit of pushing surgical boundaries I have been involved several clinical areas such as improving blood loss, surgical jigs, enhanced recovery and enhanced wound healing. I continue to evaluate, learn and work on surgical techniques to improve predictability following joint replacement surgery.

I have explored surgical techniques such as 'direct anterior approach' hip replacement. I started this surgery having studied the approach carefully, visited many surgeons in Europe and trained in cadaveric lab. We are now a year following the initial cohort of 25 patients. Although initial results were promising the complications are higher.

Wound healing remains still potential issue in joint replacement surgery. Poorly managed superficial wound issues often lead to deep infection and further surgery. In the face of increased productivity and reduced length of stay it is essential that patients are discharged home safely following surgery. I have been studying use of negative pressure wound therapy (NPWT) in incisional wounds for the last 7 years. This is a pioneering field in management of surgical wounds. I am privileged to part of faculty of the international advisory board for Smith & Nephew wound care. This is now a standard practice in our hospital for most us in revision surgery. We have completed a RCT utilizing disposable single use NPWT wound dressings in primary hip and knee replacement and published 2 papers on the findings. We are currently part of a multicentre study on NPWT with myself as a chief investigator.

I currently work with 2 orthopaedic companies in helping develop and design surgical jigs. No personal financial reward apart from commitment from the companies to invest in to hospital research facility and promote hospital as a reference center. We perform joint replacements in excess of 2500 per annum and one the highest in the country for hip and knee joint replacement, therefore it is only just that we promote our hospital as a reference center for joint replacement and revision surgery.

Clinical research in UK is difficult due to funding. I have worked hard in attracting Industry to get involved in research with us and have managed to attract several industries in the recent years. Along with my colleagues we have been able to set up prospective data collection for various hip and knee implants and we are now in a position to present our midterm results on various projects.

Over the last 16 years as a consultant I have performed over 3000 primary, complex primary and revision hip and knee joint replacements. I find every surgery is unique and thrive on perfection.

I was a Clinical director for surgery between September 2012 to September 2016. I have now relinquished this role to concentrate on teaching, training, clinical research and academics. I have recently been appointed as a Honorory Senior Lecturer from Keele University.

## EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND INTERESTS:

I play several sports. Cricket perhaps is what I have played most during my early school days. I also played table tennis and captained the medical school team. I was the Individual Champion in athletics in 1989 and represented medical school in cricket and table tennis.

I have keen interest in motor sports; I participated briefly in motor rallying during medical school days. I am a keen follower of grand prix and Moto-GP motor racing.

My current interests are motorcycling, off road biking, skiing, cycling and walking.

More recently I have discovered an interest in climbing and paragliding.
